BEFORE THE CRUISE

- Passports out of the safe, into carry-on.
- Proof of Travel Insurance supplement in carry-on.
- Go online to Royal Caribbean & register for Meet & Mingle & to print documents.
- Go online to Carnival website to print Fun Pass & documents.
- Pack all clothes on hangers. If you have a suit, or multi-piece outfit, put both on one hanger to save space which makes unpacking quicker. Put a dry cleaner bag over all clothes that wrinkle easily, this will keep them less wrinkled.
- Pack all shoes in large trash bags to keep other items clean.
- Have \$20 in small bills for tips for moving luggage & shuttle to port. Tip \$1-per-bag.
- Arrive at ship by 11am & beat the rush.
- Pack a bathing suit & sunscreen in carry-on luggage to sunbath or swim in the pool before luggage reaches cabin.

END OF CRUISE

- Have \$20 in small bills for tips: moving luggage & shuttle.
- Her completed Custom's form (if *not* married or *not* U.S. resident).
- His completed Custom's form (if married & *both* are U.S. residents).

MISC

- Artist's Putty for cabin door decoration.
- Backpack — for carrying stuff onshore
- Beach Bag, Pop Up (for pool & beach)

- Bottle, Sports, 2 with belt clips: carrying water onto ship & going onshore.
- Bubble Wrap — for packing purchases
- Bungee Cords: Tie carry-on luggage together. If an outside cabin, you can use it to tie back the balcony door, leaving the cabin open to ocean breezes.

- Card Holder, Neck Strap: 2 — 📌 To carry “Key Card” at all times. (Put in carry-on luggage before boarding for faster access.)
- Cards, Playing
- Clothes Pins, 10 — for clothes line in cabin’s shower
- Coffee Cups, Large: 2 — to carry water & coffee onboard
- Dirty Clothes Bag, collapsible
- Door Sign: Name & Photo — Use magnetic-backed paper so that sign can be affixed to cabin door (Royal Caribbean) or the wall (Carnival).
- Duct Tape (“100-mile-an-hour Tape”), 1 small roll
- Extra Soft-sided Luggage: to bring back the goodies.
- Febreze fabric freshener
- Fannie Packs, 2
- Flash Light, Small, 2: for reading menus in the lounges.
- Glasses Prescription (in case you lose your glasses)
- Glue Stick
- Magic Markers: Black, Red
- Message Board (see Tips, below)
- Night Lights (Emergency Lights), 2
- Pen, Ink: 4
- Ponchos: 2 (for inclement weather)
- Reading Glasses
- Room Deodorizers, 2: one for room, one for bathroom.
- Scissors (do not put in carry-on)
- Sewing Kit
- Shoe bag for bathroom door
- Tag, Luggage, Laminated: 2-per-piece including carry-on: 1 outside; 1 inside (in case outside tag is lost).
- Tide Stick — clean spots on clothes.
- Trash Bags for Wet Clothes, Large, 3 (for onshore beaches)
- Umbrella
- Wipes, Antiseptic Packets, Germ-X pads, 3-per-day
- Wrinkle Releaser (for clothes; not you)
- Zip Lock Bags, One Gallon, 10
- Zip Ties, 20 — in cosmetic carry-on

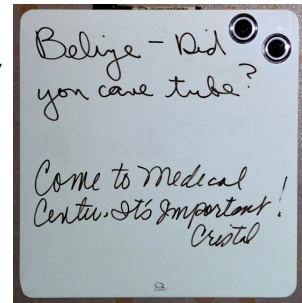

TIPS & TRICKS

★ **POSTCARD FOR MEMORIES,** Ashley: I love to document my travels, but hate carrying my journal around everywhere — & I often forget to write in it at night. I buy a postcard every day & jot down a few sentences on the back. At the end of the trip, I add the notes to a Memories box with cards from other journeys.

★ **SHOE PROTECTION,** Charlene: Disposable shower caps in motel bathrooms make great shoe covers. Just slip a cap over each shoe & you won't have to worry about getting everything in your suitcase dirty.

★ **SUNGLASSES PROTECTION,** Chris: If you don't have a sunglasses case, store your shades in one of those tube-shaped Crystal Light containers. The tubes are just the right size & rigid enough to protect the glasses. Plus, it's no great loss if you misplace one of the containers.
