

GOOGLE AS A DICTIONARY

SINGLE WORD

If you didn't know, you can use Google as a dictionary.

1. Go to Google: <http://google.com>
2. In the window, type "Define:[word]".
3. Click on "Google Search" or touch the *Enter* key, on the keyboard.

For example, if you're looking for "candor", type "define:candor" — without the quote marks — and no spaces (**Figure 1**).

You'll discover that candor means fairness and the quality of being honest and straightforward according to Princeton University's dictionary < <http://wordnet.princeton.edu/perl/webwn> > but that it is also a village located in the Town of Candor in Tioga County, New York, according to Wikipedia < [http://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Candor \(village\), New York](http://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Candor_(village),_New_York) >.

MULTIPLE WORDS

To search for multiple words, place quotes around the words.

1. Go to Google.
2. Type Define:"labor union" — with no spaces between the "define:" and the first quote mark (**Figure 2**).
3. Click on "Google Search" or touch the *Enter* key, on the keyboard.

You'll find 38 responses.
