Would you like to print just a part of a webpage?

One way to do it is to copy the text you want and paste it into Word or Word-Perfect, then print the document. However, there's an easier way.

1. Left-click, hold, and drag to highlight the specific text and/or image you want to print (**Figure 1**).

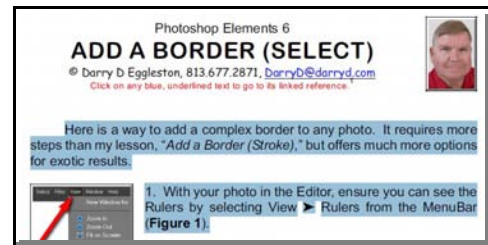

2. Use the Ctrl+P keys or, from the MenuBar, left-click on File ► Print.

3. In the Print Range dialog, Left-click on the option button for "Selection" or "Current View". Most printers show what will print in a preview screen.

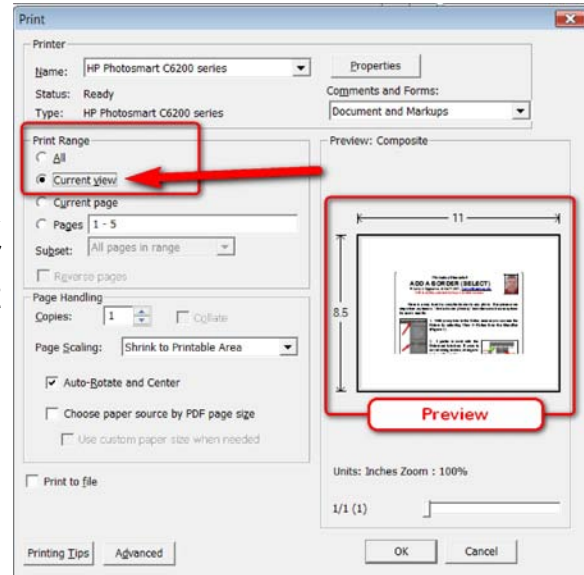

4. Left-click on "OK" button to print.
