2. In **Figure 2**, I used Quick Fix to lighten the photo (*Lesson 4-5*).

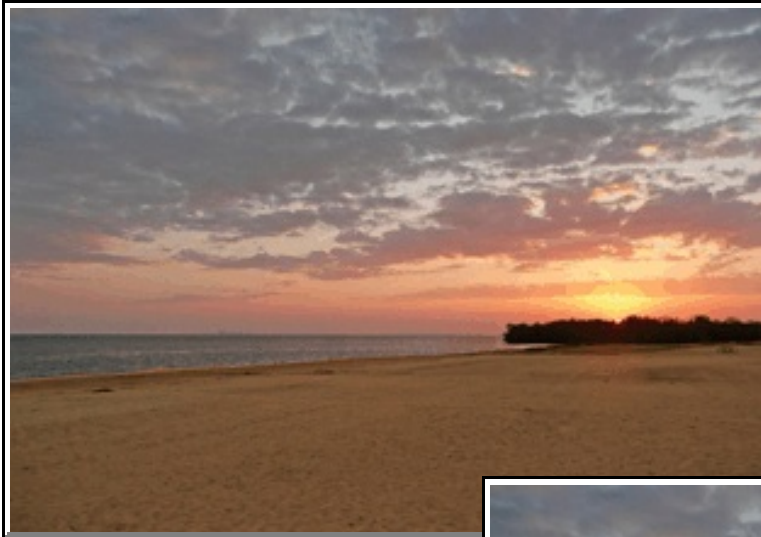

4. Next, I added a bird (Figure 4) by copying from another photo and pasting it into this photo.

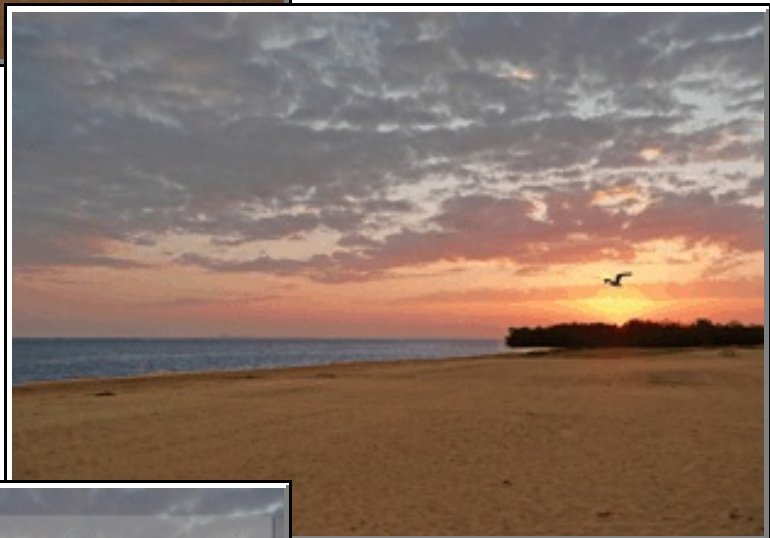

3. In the next step, I made two changes (Figure 3):

① I used the Quick Select tool to select the water, and added a blue tint to it using the Quick Fix sliding scale.

② I used the Quick Select tool to select the sand, and added a light orange tint to it.

5. Finally, I added text to the photo for a professional look.
