## Photoshop Elements 6

## **ADD A BORDER (SELECT)**

Here is a way to add a complex border to any photo. It requires more steps than my lesson, "Add a Border (Stroke)," but offers much more options for exotic results.



- 1. With your photo in the Editor, ensure you can see the Rulers by selecting View ➤ Rulers from the MenuBar (**Figure 1**).
- 2. I prefer to work with the Rulers set to inches. If yours is not showing inches, change to inches (**Figure 2**):
- 1 RIGHT-click on the Rulers.
- Left-click on "Inches".



3. Select the Rectangular Marquee tool (**Figure 3**).

- 4. Draw your selection (**Figure 4**) by Left-clicking the desired distance from the left, upper corner, holding down the button, and dragging your cursor to the lower, right corner.
- 5. 5. Since the selection is *inside* the dotted rectangle, but the border is to be *outside* the selection, from the MenuBar, choose Selection Inverse (**Figure 5**).

6. Now you'll see a dotted border along

the edges (Figure 6).



7. Create a New Layer (**Figure 7**) by Left-clicking on the icon to the upper-left in the Layers palette.





8. The New Layer appears in the Layers palette (**Figure 8**).



9. Select Paint Bucket (**Figure 9**). You'll see that I'm using Black as the color of the fill, but it doesn't matter what color you use. The color will be changed later.



10. Left-click on the selected area (**Figure 10**) to fill it with the color.



11. You now have a black-filled border (**Figure 11**).



12. Click on any of the selections in the Effects palette. I have selected "Star Glow" (**Figure 12**).

If your Effects palette is not visible, Left-click on Window ➤ Effects from the MenuBar.

13. The result is a beautiful Star Glow border (**Figure 13**).

- 15. Flatten the Layers (Figure 14):
- 1 Left-click on "more".
- Left-click on "Flatten Image".



14. Use the Ctrl+D keys to deselect (remove) the marching ants from around the border.



16. SAVE your work by using either the *Ctrl* + *S* keys or, from the MenuBar, select *File* > *Save as*.

17. Ensure that the "Image Options" is set at the Maximum quality (**Figure 15**), then Left-click on "OK" button.


