

# FRAMING WITHIN A PHOTO



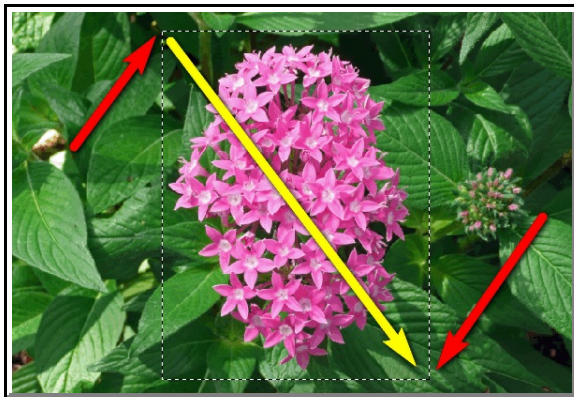
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Click on any blue, underlined text to go to its linked reference.

1. Select Picture in the Photoshop Elements 6 Organizer and bring into **Full Edit**. From the Toolbox, select Rectangular Marque tool (**Figure 1**).

2. Left-click, hold, and drag to select the area of the picture (**Figure 2**).

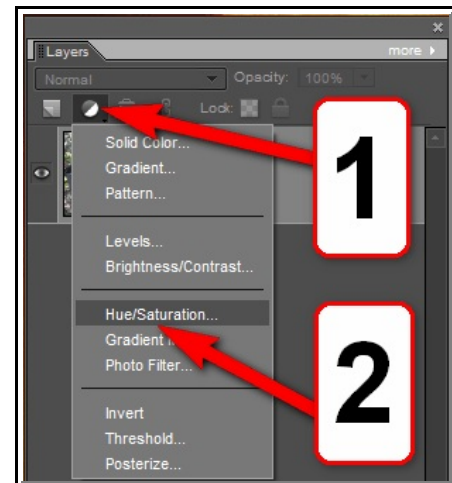
➤ You may reposition it if you do not let go of the mouse and hold down the Space Bar.

➤ If you don't like what you drew, touch and release the Esc key on the keyboard.

3. In the Layers Pallette (**Figure 3**):

❶ Add new layer using the Create Adjustment Layer.

❷ Select Hue/Saturation.

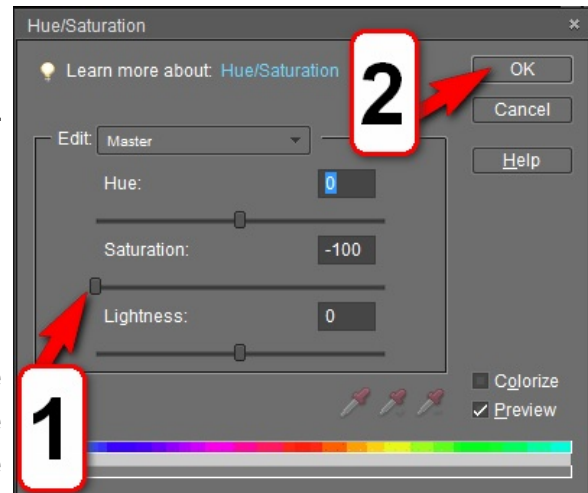
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#### 4. Change the Saturation (**Figure 4**).

① Left-click, hold, and drag the Saturation to the far left (-100).

② Left-click on OK.

The result is **Figure 5**.

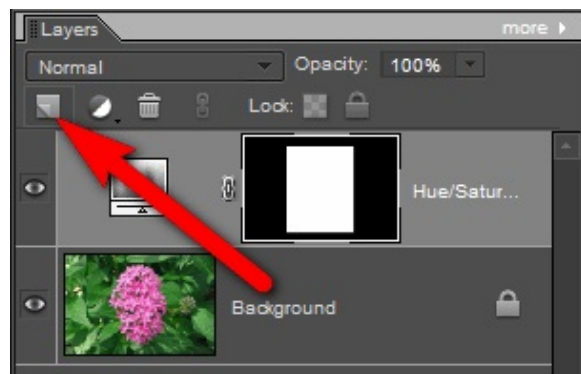
5. Inverse the selection by using the keyboard combination of **Ctrl+I**. Now the area inside the frame is colored and the outside is grayscale (**Figure 6**).

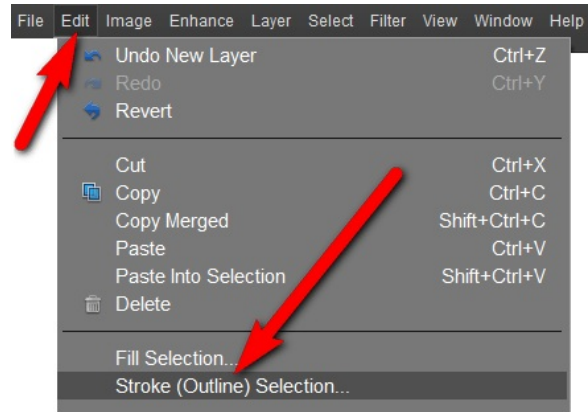

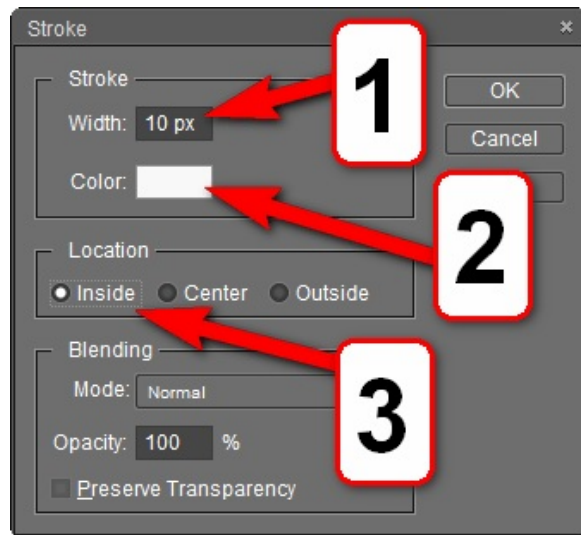
6. From the MenuBar, Left-click on **Select > Reselect**.

7. From the Layers palette, Left-click on **Create a New Layer (Figure 7)**.

8. From the Menu Bar, select **Edit ► Stroke (Outline) Selection (Figure 8)**.

9. Set the frame width (**Figure 9**):  
 ❶ Select Width of 10. (The size of the frame depends upon individual taste and the pixel size of the photo.)  
 ❷ Select color for frame.  
 ❸ Left-click on Location ► Inside.  
 ❹ When satisfied, Left-click on OK button.

10. From the MenuBar, Left-click on **Select ► Deselect (Figure 10)**.

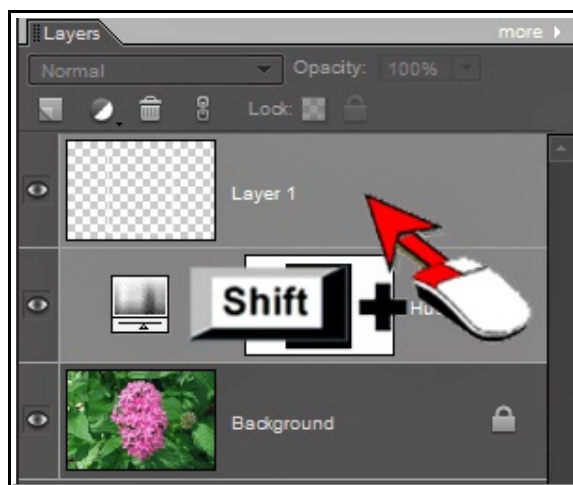


**Figure 11**

11. The result is a frame within the photo (**Figure 11**).

## SPECIAL EFFECT

12. Click on Layer 1 and hold down the Shift key, on the keyboard, and Left-click on Hue Layer — both will be highlighted (**Figure 12**).

13. From the MenuBar, Left-click on Image ► Transform ► Free Transform.

14. Now you can move the box anywhere.

15. You can rotate the frame by moving your cursor just outside the frame, Left-clicking and dragging (**Figure 13**).

You can drag the selection of the two layers onto another photo, in order to create the same effect, without having to repeat all the above steps. After selecting both layers, left-click, hold and drag the two layers onto another photo. Then, from the Menu Bar, Left-click on Image ► Transform ► Free Transform, to change size, skew and location of the frame on that second photo.
