INSERT GRAPHIC

This lesson details how to create slides, for a slideshow, using Elements. For this example, we're using an existing graphic (Figure 1).

1. Select Start > My Pictures (Figure 2).

3. Find the graphic you want to insert (Figure 3).

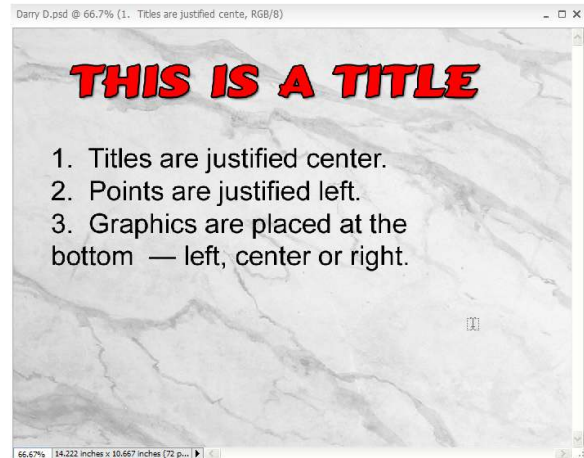

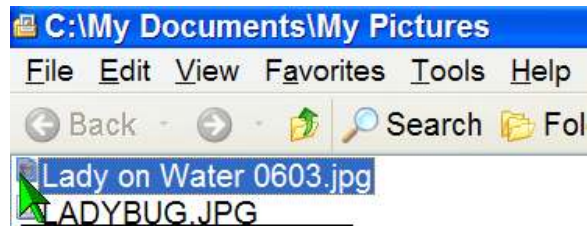

4. Left-click, hold and drag the photo from "My Pictures" to the icon for Elements, hold until the program opens and then release the button.

5. The graphic appears over the top of the document upon which you are working (Figure 4).

6. Left-click on the *TitleBar* and drag the photo out of the way (Figure 5).

7. Left-click, hold and drag the graphic into the original document (Figure 6).

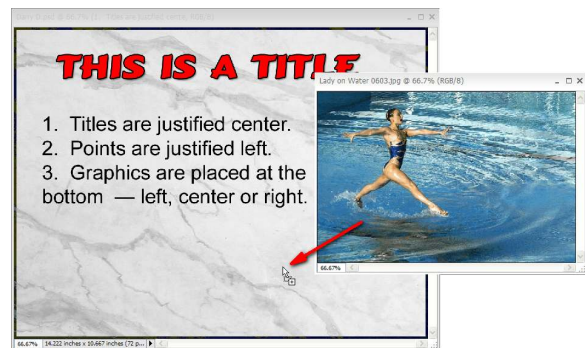

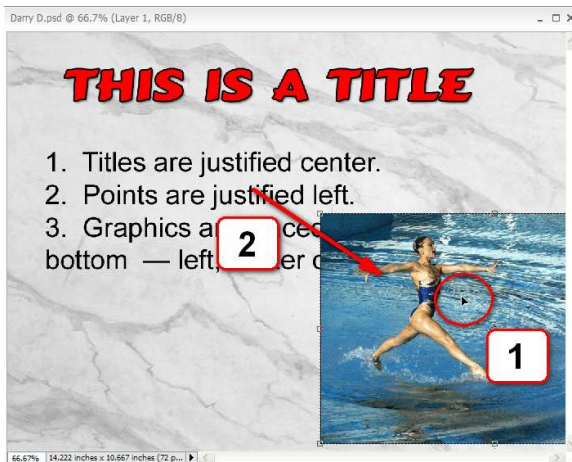

8. Position the graphic on the original document (Figure 7).

9. In the Layers palette, left-click, hold and drag the “Layer 1,” which is the graphic below the body of text (Figure 8).

10. The result is that the graphic is now behind the body of text circled in Figure 9.

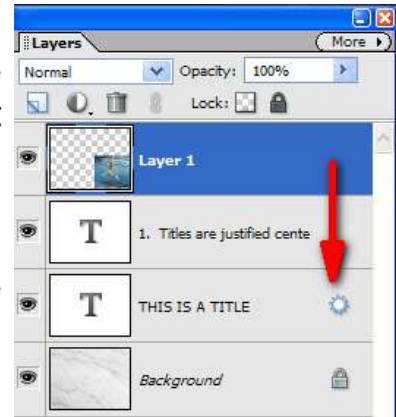

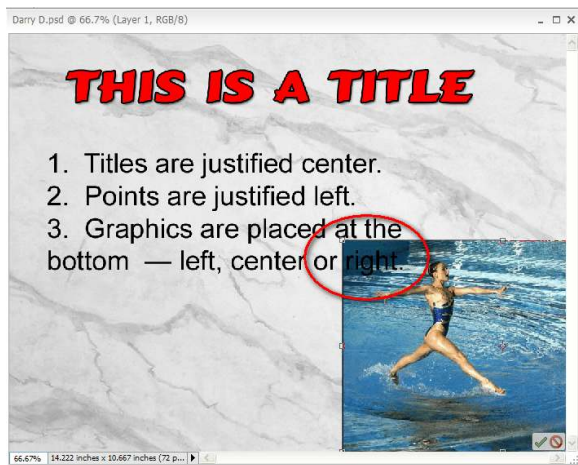

11. SAVE your work by using either the *Ctrl + S* keys or, from the MenuBar, select *File > Save*.

12. Finally, resize the text so that it flows around the graphic (Figure 10).

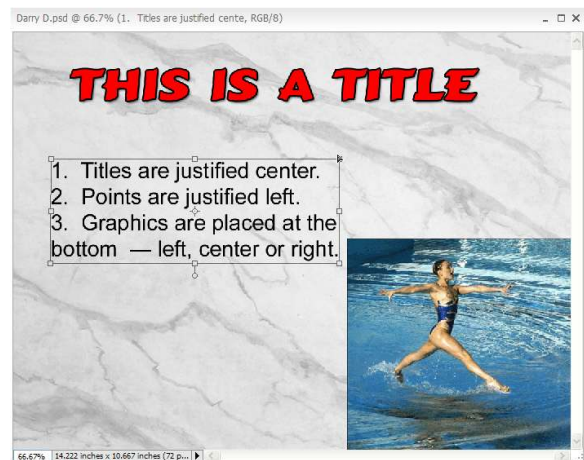
