



GRAYSCALE ON COLOR

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Click on any blue, underlined text to go to its linked reference.

In your search to create an eye-catching photo, don't forget to include in your list of magic a "grayscale on color" photo. Here's how to create one with very little work.

1. Open a photo (**Figure 1**).

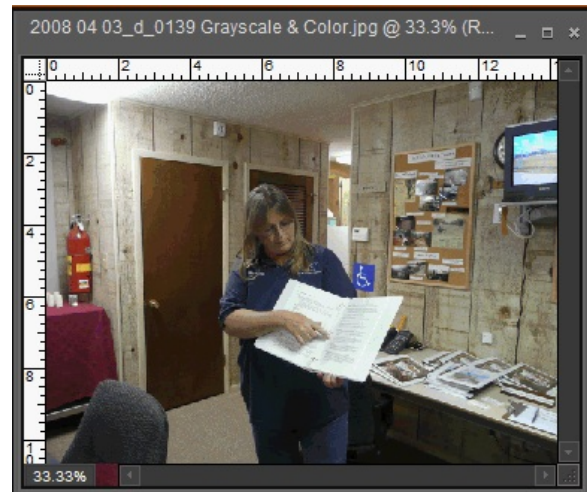

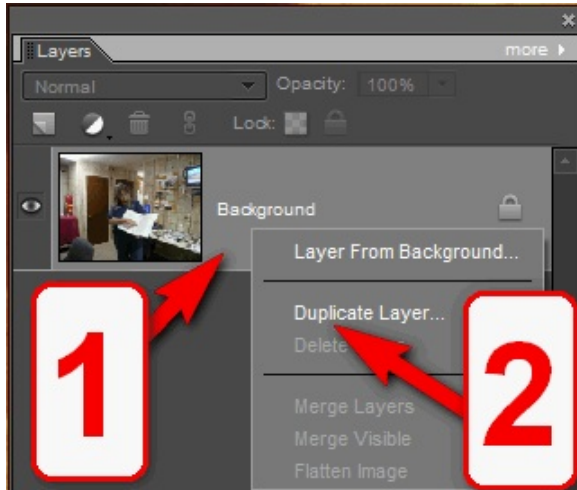

2. Create a duplicate layer (**Figure 2**):
① RIGHT-click on the Background layer.
② Left-click on "Duplicate Layer" option.

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3. Name the duplicate layer (**Figure 3**):

- ❶ Type a name if you want to do so.
- ❷ Touch the *Enter* key, on the keyboard, or click on the “OK” button.

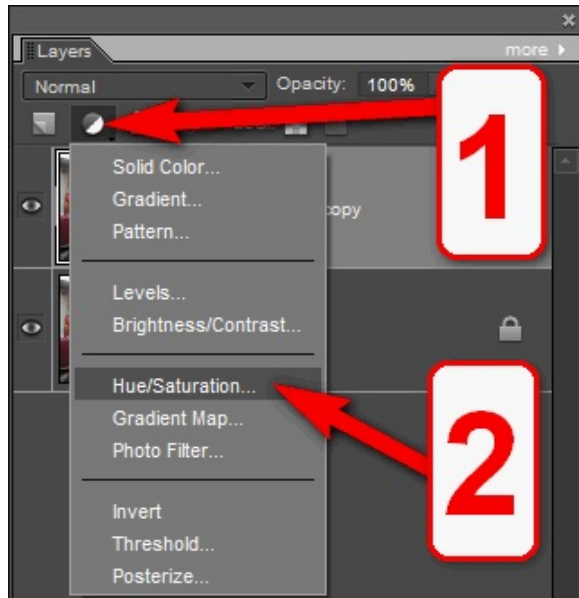

4. Select the Hue/Saturation option (**Figure 4**):

- ❶ Left-click on the two-tone, circle above the layer.
- ❷ Left-click on “Hue/Saturation” option.

5. Change the Saturation (**Figure 5**):

- ❶ Left-click, hold, and drag the Saturation toggle all the way to the left.
- ❷ Touch the *Enter* key, on the keyboard, or click on the “OK” button.

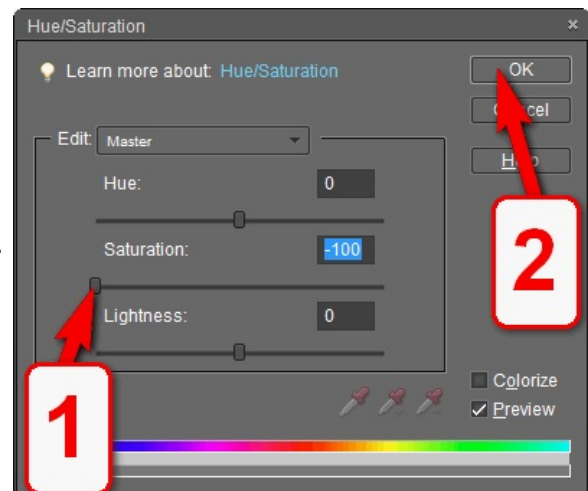

6. A new layer is added (**Figure 6**).

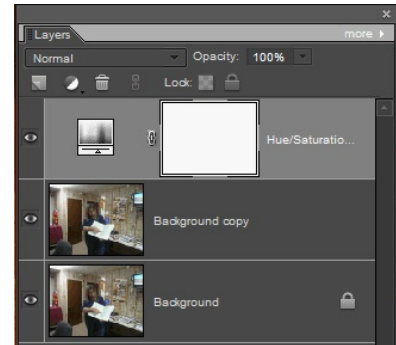

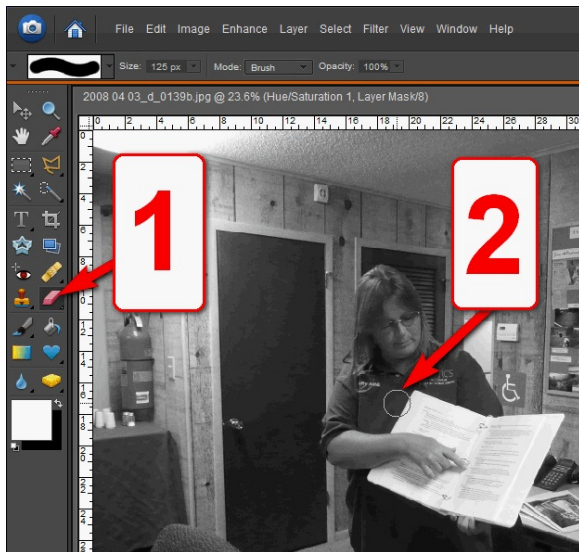

7. Upon the visible layer, which is grayscale, you can select what to show in color (**Figure 7**):

- ① Left-click on the Eraser tool  .
- ② Left-click, hold, and drag where you want the color to show.

8. The result is a wonderfully attractive photo that is eye-catching (**Figure 8**).

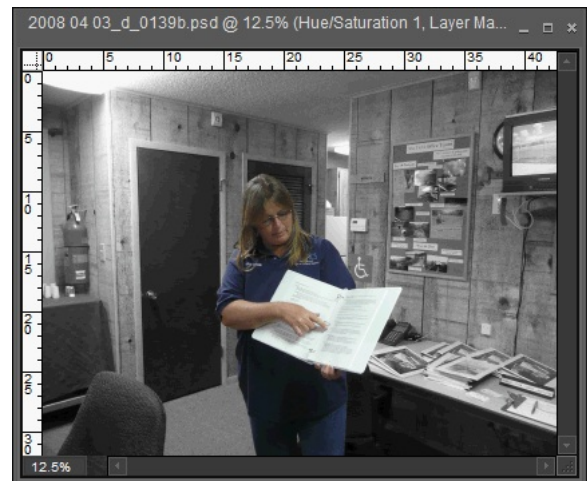
