- 1. If you set the preferences for your Organizer as I recommended, you'll see this window when you insert your camera card or connect your camera to the PC using a cable (**Figure 1**):
- 1 This is the only place you'll enter information.
- For this window to appear, there must <u>not</u> be a check in this





- 2. Enter pertinent data (Figure 2):
- Enter who took the photo.
- 2 The number in this box will be the total number of the photos you downloaded the last time you downloaded photos. Change it to '1' unless you've used multiple cards on this date.
- 6 Left-click on "Get Photos" button, or touch the Enter key on your keyboard.

3. A progress window (**Figure 3**) appears showing how many photos and videos you're downloading.




4. When the transfer of photos is completed, this window appears (**Figure 4**). While I don't have Elements Organizer open, you may chose to do so.

5. Go to the folder which you have selected for the loading of your photos. In this case, I've taken photos on three different dates (**Figure 5**).

6. Double, left-click on a folder to view its contents (**Figure 6**). Do this so that you'll know what to title the folder.

7. RIGHT-click on the folder, and left-click on "Rename" to change the title of the folder. Along with the date, include the event covered by photos and the videos in each folder (**Figure 7**).
