

PLAYING AN MP3 CD

When you have a CD full of mp3 music, you're going to want to play it. MP3 is an acronym of MPEG-1 or MPEG-2 audio layer 3. It is a compressed audio format that still allows a relatively high sound quality while reducing the file size. A compression rate of 12:1 is possible through MP3.

This is how to do it.

1. When the CD is inserted and recognized, you'll get an AutoPlay window. Click on "Open folder to view files" — the last choice (Figure 1).

2. When the files are shown (Figure 2):

- 1 Left-click on any file.
- 2 Use the Ctrl + A keys to select all files.

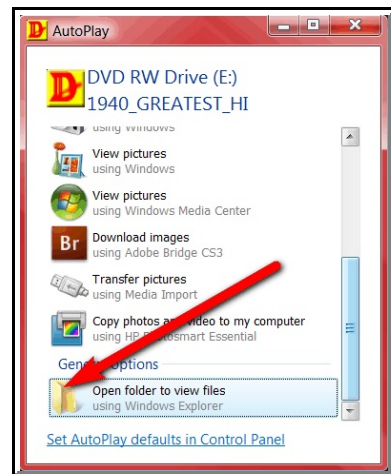

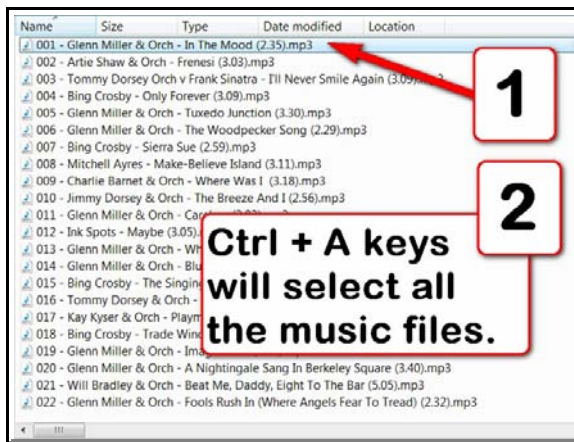

3. Play the music:

- ① **RIGHT**-click on the selected area.
- ② Left-click on “Play” in the popup window (Figure 3).

4. Use the Player (Figure 4):

- ① All songs and playing times appear.
- ② You can expand the file list by moving your cursor to the vertical line between the graphic and the list. Left-clicking, hold, and drag the vertical line to the left.
- ③ To play any song not being played, double-left-click on that song.
- ④ Left-click on the Pause button to pause.
- ⑤ Left-click on the “X” to exit.
