From time-to-time, you're going to want to know what version of a program you are using.

While I'll be using WordPerfect as the example, the process for determining the version is the same in any Windows programs.

Here's how.

1. Open the program.
2. From the MenuBar (**Figure 1**), select Help ► About....

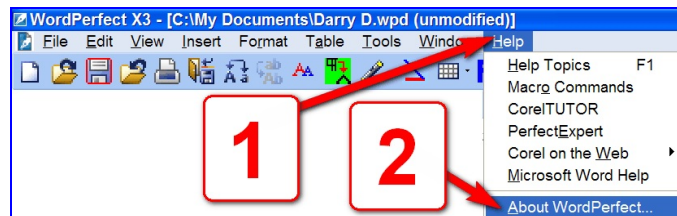

3. The data for your program appears (**Figure 2**).
