WPD VERSUS PDF





The lady asked, "Darry D says the printed quality of the PDF will be same as WordPerfect Document (WPD). That seems strange when the WPD file is 46,944 Kb and the PDF is only 1,250 Kb. How can that be?"

The difference in file size is that PDF strips out all the hidden codes — i.e., **bold**, *italic*, <u>underlines</u>, changes in font size, hard returns, etc. — and only shows the text and graphics.

For example, Figure 1 shows the Reveal Codes behind the previous paragraph. In an Adobe portable document format (PDF) document, all that is stripped out.

A PDF is, in effect, a snapshot of the WP document from which it is published.

By the way, there are three ways to use Reveal Codes:

- RIGHT-click at the place where you wish to reveal codes. Then, left click on "Reveal Codes".
- ② From the MenuBar, select View ➤ Reveal Codes.
- Use Alt+F3 (hold down the Alt key, touch F3 function key, releasing both quickly).
