

Windows XP DISK CLEANUP

Disk Cleanup, a component of Windows XP, checks downloaded program files that are no longer useful.

1. Double-click on “Disk Cleanup” (**Figure 1**) if it’s on the desktop. If it’s not, you’ll have to select Start > All Programs > Accessories > System Tools > Disk Cleanup.

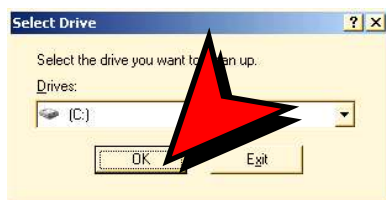

2. Click on “OK” button (**Figure 2**).

3. The progress window appears (**Figure 3**).

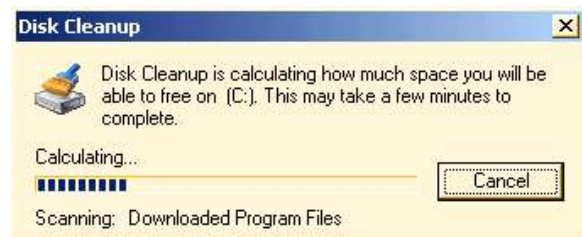

4. Click on the “OK” button and it will remove the files. As you can see in **Figure 4**, there are 2,563 Kb (2.5 Mb) occupied by files that are useless.

ALL boxes must be checked.

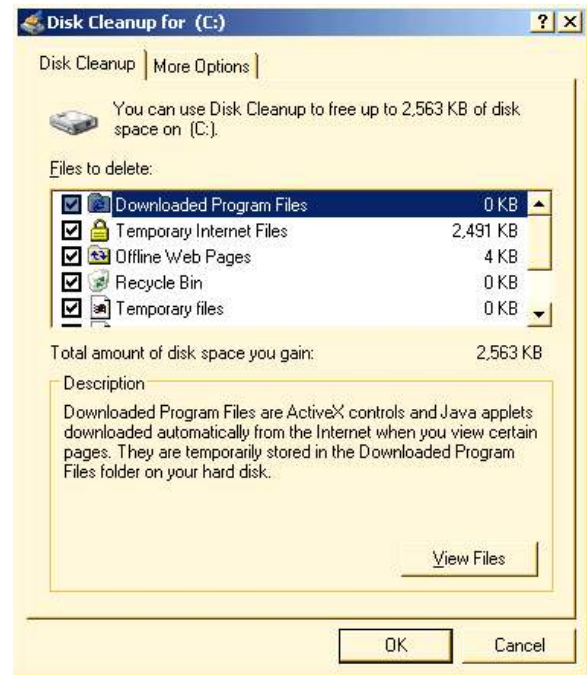

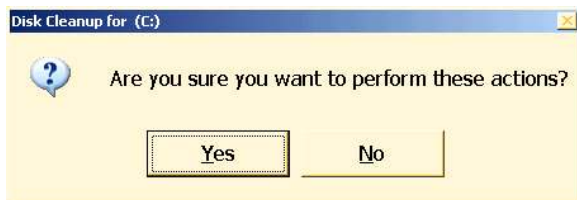

5. The Confirmation window appears (**Figure 5**). Click on the “Yes” button.

When it disappears, all the chosen files have been eliminated.

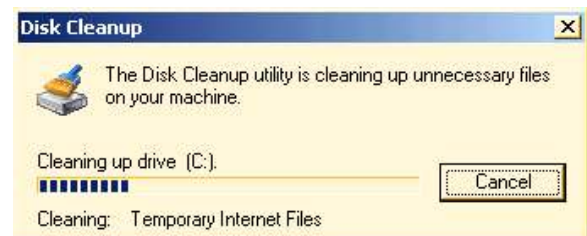
