CREATE A DOWNLOAD FOLDER

By default, Windows (prior to Windows Vista) saved downloaded programs to the desktop. This is often not only inconvenient, it creates more clutter to an already over-crowded desktop. (The *Default* is that which occurs unless the user can and does change it.)

(In Windows Vista, downloaded files are saved to a Download folder in your User folder, i.e. "Darry D\Downloads" folder.

So this is how to create a special Download folder.

1. Open My Computer:

- In Windows XP, select Start > My Computer.
- In Windows 98/Me, double, left-click on Desktop shortcut.

2. In Windows XP, double, left-click on the C drive.

- Windows 98/Me users go to Step 3.

3. From the MenuBar, select File > New > Folder (**Figure 1**).

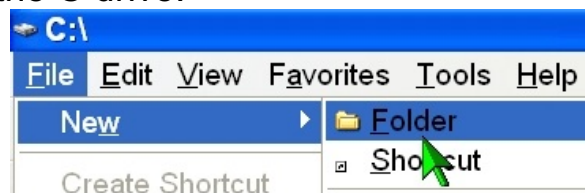

4. Type "Download" (without the quote marks) and touch the Enter key, on the keyboard.

Now, when you go online to download a file:

- ❶ Click on the link to the download.
- ❷ Click on the "Save" button.
- ❸ Click on the downward arrow next to the destination.

❹ Scroll to the "Download" folder. From this point on, unless you change that folder, every time you go to download a file, the Download folder will be the default folder listed.
